Lagomarsino Project Resumes

We're set to resume work on the Lagomarsino Canyon Petroglyph recording project! This year, we'll be out recording for nearly the entire month of October and into the first week of November. Because it takes so much time to set up and take down for any large project like this, we're trying a new approach on this multi-year project. We'll alternate crew chieves (so those of us who still have a regular job can keep that job by showing up from time to time!) and continue on working throughout the month. This will give everyone a chance to find a time to participate in this spectacular project that will fit their schedule. And it will also allow us to keep working on days that would otherwise have been used in setting up and taking down flagging tape!

The session will kick-off with Recording Training (in class) on October 9th (at the KNPB building, 1670 No. Virginia St. in Reno, 9am-3pm), followed by field training at Lagomarsino on October 10th. Trainees will be supervised by seasoned volunteers who've worked at Lagomarsino before and can "show 'em the ropes." This is really a

great way to learn how to record rock art, by teaming up an experienced volunteer with someone new, under the watchful eye of the crew chief. As always, training is limited to 20 so reserve a space now - and the number of volunteers on-site each day will also be limited. So if you haven't returned the Lagomarsino mailer that came in the mail a while back, you'd better do it now, or risk getting left out of this



awesome opportunity. We'll also be inking during the day, so if you're more interested in "office work" than "field work" - don't let that stop you from signing up to help out! BOTH parts of the process are important, and the office workers make a really significant contribution to the project by finalizing the work done by the field workers.

But probably the best news of all is that due to Bennett family connections the Western Village in Sparks has generously offered to give NRAF members an extreme discount on rooms - \$25 per day! It costs almost that much to camp and you'd have to sleep on the ground! After you return the mailer, an information sheet will be sent to you with details on the project, or you can contact Ralph & Cheryln Bennett (benart@att.net) for information on how you can take part in this fabulous project!



or we can sell your work at the NRAF table ... for a small





Preserve a Panel Program is Up and Running!

The Lagomarsino Canyon Petroglyph recording project is the Foundation's largest project, one that is going to run for many years. Unlike most of our other projects which are on public lands and for which public funds are available, Lagomarsino is on county land and so funding is limited. The Nevada Rock Art Foundation would like to acknowledge the National Endowment for the Arts and the US Forest Service for a grant awarded in 2004. We'd also like to thank Storey County, the WNRC&D-NRCS, the USFS and the Nevada Arts Council for their support of our grant application. In the continuing effort to raise long-term funds for this project and to allow direct involvement by individuals in the documentation and future protection of Lagomarsino, we have also designed the Preserve-a-Panel program. This new sponsorship program allows anyone to select a panel from Lagomarsino that speaks to them most clearly and that they want to help document through a specific donation. The program is in 3 parts: Preserve a Panel - a \$1,000 donation allows you to select your favorite panel for documentation; Conserve a Panel - a \$5,000 donation will see to it that a damaged panel will get the conservation treatment it requires and Preserve a Landscape - a \$25,000 donation gives you the opportunity to select a spectacular section of the site to have recorded in your name. Gifts include framed photographs of "your" panel or section and acknowledgement of your contribution in all future publications where the panel or section is discussed. This is a wonderful opportunity for an individual or a group of friends who want to make a significant contribution to the rock art of Nevada. 

Code of Ethics

The Nevada Rock Art Foundation subscribes to the following Code of Ethics and encourages its members, as a condition of membership, to abide by the standards of conduct stated herein.

- 1. NRAF members will be respectful at rock art sites many are regarded as sacred by indigenous peoples and as such will be treated as a valued part of our shared cultural heritage.
- 2. All local, state, and national antiquities laws will be strictly adhered to by the membership of NRAF.All research or educational activities taking place at rock art sites shall be subject to appropriate regulations and property access requirements.

- All rock art recording shall be nondestructive with regard to the rock art itself and the associated archaeological remains which may be present.
- 4. NO artifacts shall be collected unless the work is done as part of a legally constituted program of archaeological survey or excavation and with express permission of the land holder.
- 5. No excavation shall be conducted unless the work is done as part of a legally constituted excavation project and with the express permission of the land holder. Removal of soil shall not be undertaken at any time for the sole purpose of exposing subsurface rock art.
